## **SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

Children in Janice class covered a unit; “The beatitudes, Mathew 5: 1-12” and covered topics like; Heirs of the kingdom of heaven, the poor in spirit, The meek, hunger and thirst for righteousness, The merciful, the peace makers, the pure in heart and Persecution for serving Christ. They actively participated in every session and recited memory verses.

Children in Janice class covered a unit; “The miracles of Jesus Christ” and covered topics like; Jesus changes water into wine, John 2:1-11; Jesus heals a paralyzed man at the pool, John 5:1-14; Jesus feeds the five thousand John 6:5-12; and Jesus walks on the water John 6:16-21. They also participated actively in class and recited memory verses.

Devotions were great, we enjoyed children participating in prayer, Bible reading and praise and worship.

The Sunday school at Bwera worship center is growing, the number of children has increased to 158. This is all the impact of the CDE program.

## **PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

One of our sponsored CDE029 Kabugho Juliet received a bed and mattress from her sponsor. Juliet is an orphan who has never owned a bed and mattress; it’s a great miracle and a big testimony. Her family and relatives are very grateful for what God has done for Juliet.

Children enjoyed good meals during all center days.

Every child received a bar of soap and enjoyed great meals during center days.

We are grateful for the medical and food funds, sick children have been treated and children who need food supplements have been helped. God bless the sponsors who have continued to contribute towards this pool.

### **Challenges**

- Thirty eight registered children do not have beds and beddings.

### **COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

Third term has begun and all our children have reported to their schools; they finished beginning of term examinations and we believe their performance will be better than that of last term.

English lessons and remedial classes are going on successfully at the center.

### **Challenges**

- Most of our children sent back from school because they have not finished paying school fees. We need to pay at least \$20 for each child every term that is \$60 a year if they have to be in school. This is a top up on what the government pays for a child. We are praying desperately but with faith that God will open a wide door for fees because we cannot meet it in our monthly budget.

### **SOCIAL- EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT ASPECT**

Nine children received gifts from their sponsors and have written thank you letters. These gifts are very helpful to the children; they help them to buy things that assist them in their homes. Some of our children have been able to buy chicken which they rare and will be able to as sit them and their families.

Children enjoyed their physical education classes and play times at the center.

During our parents' meeting, we taught parents about positive parenting and how to fight domestic violence. It was a great time.
